Understanding Trauma - \$25

2/5/25, 8:30am-12:00pm

This training will provide parents, foster parents, care providers and professionals with an understanding of trauma and its potential effects on children, as well as the coping strategies often used by children who have experienced trauma. Also discussed will be the importance of self-care, developing strategies for preventing burnout and secondary traumatic stress, as well as ways to build resilience in children and families. **Available to the public**

Sexuality & Boundaries - \$25

2/5/25, 1:00pm-4:30pm

Discussing sexuality and personal boundaries with children can be difficult for even the most confident parents. It can be even more challenging to have these conversations with children and adolescents with developmental disabilities. Because research shows that children with developmental disabilities are at higher risk of being sexually abused or exploited, it is important that parents educate their children about their bodies, how to set personal boundaries and how to stay safe. This training will provide participants with some basic tools and language to facilitate healthy discussions and education around sexuality and boundaries. **Available to the public**

Safety-Care for Families

This course provides parents, family members and caregivers with the skills, interventions and confidence needed to improve behavior and prevent, minimize, and manage potentially dangerous incidents. The Safety-Care for Families curriculum consists of three separate sessions: Essentials, Intermediate, and Advanced. Each session is a prerequisite for the next, and classes must be completed in order.

1. Essential Skills - 2/25/25, 8:30am-3:30pm - \$50

Collaboration with professionals, legal issues, challenging behavior, reinforcement, safety habits, managing your own behavior, differential reinforcement, antecedents to challenging behavior, triggers, signals, basic principles of de-escalation, and development of a comprehensive family safety plan. **Available to the public**

2. Intermediate Skills* - 2/26/25, 8:30am-11:30am - \$25

Use of behavioral momentum to improve cooperation, advanced de-escalation strategies, management of weapons, basic physical safety skills, releasing from holds. **Available to Woodfords families/affiliates only**

3. Advanced Skills* - 2/26/25, 12:30pm-3:30pm - \$25

Emergency physical intervention, one-person stability hold, two-person stability hold (optional), releasing from stability hold, recovery and debriefing. **Available to Woodfords families/affiliates only**

The initial training classes are open to any adults, and are required before participation in advanced training. The advanced classes include personal physical safety and physical holding techniques. These procedures are intended to be used only as a last resort, to enhance safety in the event that an individual with disabilities engages in very dangerous behavior. They do, however, present a risk of serious harm, especially if used improperly.
